

School Fee Summary 2018-2019

Basic Educational Services Fees

Services, supports and materials required for a student to successfully complete a prescribed program of instruction as defined in the Guide to Education. Examples may include in-class instruction and supports, handouts, textbooks, mandatory workbooks, paid electronic educational content and photocopying.

LRSD No. 68 charges no fees for Basic Educational Services.

Locker Fee

A locker fee is charged to new students only in our school. This fee is charged *once* in six years. (student keeps the same locker and lock for all six years). The fee is collected and used to purchase new locks when locks are broken or lost.

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Enhanced Educational Services (assigned by Principal of School)

Services, supports and materials that are not required for a student to successfully complete a prescribed program of instruction as defined in the Guide to Education. Examples may include curricular field trips, programs of choice, cultural activities, options programming.

All fees are cost recovery.

Art

Junior High Art this course teaches students about different ways of creating art such as ink, watercolors, chalk pastels and oil pastels. There is also a clay unit in the junior high class where the students create animals and people. Students are also provided with sketchbooks in which they develop ideas and complete small scale assignments in pencil and ink.

Senior High Art this course teaches students about creating art for public display. Students work with a wide variety of chalk pastel, oil pastel and oil paint. Each student is provided with a sketchbook to develop ideas and complete specific assignments. Students also work with wire, plaster of paris, gauze, beads and clay in a 3D unit.

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Construction

This course teaches students to use hand tools to measure cut and connect wood products. As students move from Jr. to Sr. High, the course will also assist students to learn how to safely use power tools. They will create a number of projects to practice and test their skills. Students may also choose to complete larger projects. All day to day construction materials are purchased using these funds. Students will bring completed projects home.

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Cosmetology

This course takes a hands-on practical approach to personal grooming and care as well as teaching the essence of hairstyling and esthetics industries and opportunities. Teaching students professionalism, customer care and service as well as basic skills to perform a multitude of services, all while enhancing cooperation, collaboration and interactions with customers from the local community. Industry standard hair products are purchased at a significantly reduced cost through a bulk buying arrangement.

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Digital Design Option	
This cost covers materials used in the 3D printers or printing and proofing photographs.

Fabrication	
This course teaches multiple welding procedures that involve a large amount of material that students create and may take home if they choose. Students learn how to safely use welding equipment.	
Gr 10-12	\$50.00
Floral Design	
This course focuses on the essence of floral and greenery care and preparation in order to create a variety of floral designs. Learning to recognize and use appropriate floral and greenery species and apply their knowledge to a multitude of designs and creations ranging from simple to complex for a variety of occasions. Students learn to apply the elements of design to a variety of projects, while learning to be creative, innovative, problem solvers, and to be meticulous and practical with their use of a variety of raw materials. Learning to work with customers to see their vision and to create specific designs will be incorporated.

Food Services	
Junior High Foods – Career and Technology Foundations (CTF) Foods is an introduction to Food Studies. Students explore their interests, passions and skills in the area of food studies and preparation	
High School Foods – Students enrolled in Foods, 10, 20 and 30 learn how to produce a wide variety of hot meals, snacks, desserts and baked goods in an industrial kitchen setting. They become familiar with commercial kitchen equipment, are able to interpret recipes and learn how to work according to provincial food safety and sanitation standards.

The fee is to cover transportation costs to and from the golf course.

Mechanics	
Junior High Mechanics teaches the basics of vehicle care, tasks such as tire change, tire patch, oil change.	
High School Mechanics teaches basics of vehicle service and care, includes a range of tasks from oil changes to transmission/brake servicing and will assist students to learn how to safely work on vehicles.

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Fundraising

Fees and Fundraising cover the tournament, zone, league fees and officiating costs, as well as 2/3 busing costs. The final 1/3 of busing is from the Casino Fundraiser.

Uniform Deposit: (\$75.00)

****ALL fees must be paid in full prior to a uniform being issued.**

“Paid in Full” can include payment all at once by cheque or cash, a series of post dated cheques, or a signed Kidsport form.

**Cheque will be returned to you when the uniform is returned, undamaged. Any uniform that is lost or damaged beyond “normal wear and tear” will be paid out of the deposit, with Sports Society issuing a cheque to the parent or guardian for any difference owing. In the unlikely event of loss or damage greater than \$75.00, the parent/guardian will be billed for the difference.

Orange and Grapefruit Fundraiser: All students participate in a sport during the year are expected to participate in the Orange and Grapefruit Fundraiser. Order forms are typically available at the end of December or early January. This date fluctuates due to the inconsistency of the weather at the orchard, in California. Orders are always due in January with the fruit arriving a couple of weeks later. This fundraiser does not contribute back to the fundraising deposit.

Refund Policy:

Full refund will be given to players who:

- Are injured in pre-season camp or no later than one game into the regular season.
- Are forced to work for family reasons.
- Decide to make a serious commitment to another sport.
- Family move to a different school community.

NO refund will be given for players who:

- Quit after the pre-season camp because they choose to work or don't feel like playing.
- Are removed from the team for disciplinary reasons once the season has started.
