School Fee Summary Document 2019-2020

Basic Educational Services Fees

Services, supports and materials required for a student to successfully complete a prescribed program of instruction as defined in the Guide to Education. Examples may include in-class instruction and supports, handouts, textbooks, mandatory workbooks, paid electronic educational content and photocopying.

LRSD No. 68 charges no fees for Basic Educational Services

Locker Fee

A locker fee is charged to new students only in our school. This fee is charged *once* in six years. (student keeps the same locker and lock for all six years). The fee is collected and used to purchase new locks when locks are broken or lost.

Enhanced Educational Services (assigned by Principal of School)

Services, supports and materials that are not required for a student to successfully complete a prescribed program of instruction as defined in the Guide to Education. Examples may include curricular field trips, programs of choice, cultural activities, options programming. All fees are cost recovery.

Art

Junior High Art - This course teaches students about different ways of creating art such as ink, watercolors, chalk pastels and oil pastels. There is also a clay unit in the junior high class where the students create animals and people. Students are also provided with sketchbooks in which they develop ideas and complete small scale assignments in pencil and ink.

Senior High Art - This course teaches students about creating art for public display. Students work with a wide variety of chalk pastel, oil pastel and oil paint. Each student is provided with a sketchbook to develop ideas and complete specific assignments. Students also work with wire, plaster of paris, gauze, beads and clay in a 3D unit.

Construction

Junior High Construction - This course will introduce basic woodworking tools and techniques. Students will use those skills to work through a challenge, or series of challenges in order to solve a problem.

Senior High Construction - This course will introduce the basics of construction and cabinet making through a series of projects. Each project will introduce a basic skill or idea. Once a student has finished these projects, they will have the freedom to develop a project that is of interest to them. As students progess through 2000 and 3000 levels in this course, projects will become more involved, and students will gain a deeper understanding of the required skills.

Cosmetology

Junior High Cosmetology is an exploratory course where students can try a wide range of Cosmetology components to see where their interests are moving into high school.

Senior High Cosmetolgy - This course takes a hands-on practical approach to personal grooming and care as well as teaching the essence of hairstyling and esthetics industries and opportunities. Teaching students professionalism, customer care and service as well as basic skills to perform a multitude of services, all while enhancing cooperation, collaboration and interactions with customers from the local community. Industry standard hair produts are purchased at a significantly reduced cost through a bulk buying arrangement.

Fabrication

Floral Design

This course focuses on the essence of floral and greenery care and preparation in order to create a variety of floral designs. Learning to recognize and use appropriate floral and greenery species and apply their knowledge to a multitude of designs and creations ranging from simple to complex for a variety of occasions. Students learn to apply the elements of design to a variety of projects, while learning to be creative, innovative, problem solvers, and to be meticulous and practical with their use of a variety of raw materials. Learning to work with customers to see their vision and to create specific designs will be incorporated.

Food Services

Junior High Foods - Career and Technology Foundations (CTF) Foods is an exploration of the food industry as it relates to students' interest, passions, and skills. We look at many different facets of the industry and explore many different careers, as well as skills needed in those jobs. Fees cover food the students prepare and consume in our class.

Senior High Foods - Career and Technology Studies (CTS) - Students enrolled in this course learn how to produce a variety of foods destined for sale in our Cafeteria. They also hone their job skills by participating in the decision-making and planning phases of kitchen work, as well as develop personal skills valuable in the workplace. Individual educational plans are designed to allow the student to pursue individual interests and are tailored for their skill level. Fees cover food the students prepare and consume in our class.

This will start with regular maintenance procedures, and extend to diagnostics and major repair and overhaul procedures. This will be accomplished through a combination of demonstration and hands on experience. Students who show an understanding of the required principles may have an apportunity to take on more challenging projects. As students progress through 2000 and 3000 levels in this course, projects will become more involved, and students will gain a deeper understanding of the required skills.

Fundraising

Fees and Fundraising cover the tournament, zone, league fees and officiating costs, as well as 2/3 bussing costs. The final 1/3 of busing is from the Casino Fundraiser.

Uniform Deposit: (\$75.00)

**ALL fees must be paid in full prior to a uniform being issued.

"Paid in Full" can include payment all at once by cheque or cash, a series of postdated cheques, or a signed Kidsport form.

** Cheque will be returned to you when the uniform is returned, undamaged. Any uniform that is lost or damaged beyond "normal wear and tear" will be paid out of the deposit, with Sports Society issuing a cheque to the parent or guardian for any difference owing. In the unlikely event of loss or damage greater that \$75.00, the parent/guardian will be billed for the difference.

Orange and Grapefruit Fundraiser: <u>All students</u> participating in a sport during the year are expected to participate in the Orange and Grapefruit Fundraiser. Order forms are typically availabe at the end of December or early January. This date fluctuates due to the inconsistency of the weather at the orchard, in California. Orders are always due in January with the fruit arriving a couple of weeks later. This fundraiser does not contribute back to the fundraising deposit.

Refund Policy:

Full refund will be given to players who:

- * Are injured in pre-season camp or not later than one game into the regular season.
- * Are forced to work for family reasons.
- * Decide to make a serious commitment to another sport.
- * Family move to a different school community.

NO refund will be given for players who:

- * Quit after the pre-season camp because they choose to work or don't feel like playing.
- * Are removed from the team for disciplinary reasons once the season has started.
